

Cherry Knolls 'Little Free Library'

Looking for a good book to read? Check out Cherry Knolls' Little Free Library! Located at 6877 S. Elizabeth St. in the front yard of our neighbor, Rod Mack, this book kiosk is one of 50,000 "Little Free Libraries" (LFL) spread across the world in all 50 states and in 70 countries. Started in 2010 in Hudson, Wisconsin, LFL grew out of two friends' interest in the "take a book, leave a book" collections in coffee shops and public spaces. They created Little Free Library to inspire a love of reading, build community by fostering neighborhood book exchanges around the world.

Thanks to a story on 9News, Rod became interested in Little Free Library. He has always loved books and reading, so building a place for a community book exchange fit well with his interests. He used recycled materials, including a cabinet he found at Savers, to build his library, then stocked it with some books. Since setting it up at the end of March, many neighbors have contributed to the library, including kids and adults. Be sure to stop by to check out the latest selection!



Japanese Beetles

Japanese beetles are a destructive pest that chomp on close to 300 landscape plants, including annuals, perennials, trees and shrubs. The short list includes: roses, Virginia creeper, grape vines, and raspberries. The

key to prevention is to get your neighbors to collectively work together in an effort to keep them at bay. One remedy is Milky Spore which targets and kills Japanese beetle grubs (that live in your lawn), before they can grow into adult beetles. In areas treated by Milky Spore, Japanese beetle grub eat the spores then the spores reproduce inside the grub, eventually killing grub within 7-21 days. As the grub decomposes, it releases millions of new spores and these multiply and kill other grubs. Milky Spore is safe for people, pets, wildlife, beneficial insects, and soil microorganisms. It is approved and registered with the US Environmental Protection Agency.

You can treat your lawn any time of year when the ground is not frozen. It works best to apply just before rainfall, or water in lightly after application to soak into soil. Milky Spore can be found at The Big Tool Box @ the Highlands Garden Center:
