

Putting your garden to rest

Your perennial garden is simply sleeping and storing energy for next year. Make sure you water plants once or twice a month, twice a month during dry stretches. Rose bushes benefit from being mulched around the base. Wait to prune roses until late Spring.


Annuals should be pulled from your garden. Cut the plants into 2" chunks and make a compost pile for your garden next year. Mix these cuttings with your kitchen waste. Perennials can be pruned back and cleaned up next Spring when new growth emerges.

Dahlias can be dug up, divided and stored in your garage. YouTube videos are the best form of instruction. If you're interested in growing some next summer, check out Arrowhead Dahlias, a local supplier.






