- We have had legally enforceable covenants in place since 1958 (a novel idea at that time). They were put in place for the purpose of respect for neighbors.
- We are governed by a volunteer board of 10 people who serve for 2 years.
- We have a long list of volunteers who spend countless hours doing various jobs from maintaining our perimeter, keeping our entrances looking beautiful, creating our newsletter and directory, maintaining our website, managing our neighborhood database for mailings and the directory, looking to future projects to improve the neighborhood, creating a sense of community through neighborhood events focused on young families, welcoming new neighbors, mentoring our swim team, maintaining our great swim club, monitoring Centennial and community issues and finally, maintaining our own Cherry Field park.
- We have a website, a bi-monthly newsletter, bylaws, covenants, & directory
- Our dues are \$120 a year (that's \$10 a month). Dues have remained the same for over 20 years despite inflation. Without your support it will be difficult to maintain the quality our neighborhood. Please contribute to our amazing neighborhood by paying your dues--we need everyone's help.

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TRASH TALK In an effort to encourage a sense of community and neighborhood pride, the City of Centennial is reminding residents about the garbage and trash can "Code Compliance". **Fines may be given as of 2020.** The current law states:

"Garbage cans can be placed up to 24 hours in the public street, **not on the sidewalk**, to accommodate trash removal. Garbage cans must be stored in areas NOT visible from the street, and lids must be used to minimize odors and keep pets away."




