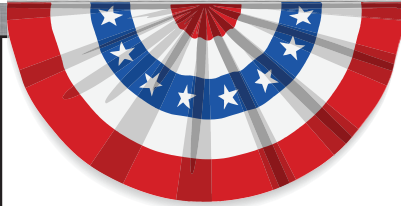

CHERRY KNOLLS JULY 4th PARADE

Due to current conditions every-one participating in the parade this year will be **required to be in a vehicle**. Fortunately the fire truck will still lead the way!

Get your cars, trucks, & trailers decked out and ready to roll!

This year's parade route has been extended to allow for social distancing and compliance with Tri-County's regulations.

Vehicles will line up at 9:15 behind the fire truck, parade starts promptly at 9:30 am.

Stay Safe Parade Rules:

- Decorate vehicles, but no obstructed views
- No bikes of pedestrians, passengers stay in vehicles
- Keep a safe distance between vehicles
- No fireworks
- No throwing items from vehicles (bubble blowers are allowed)

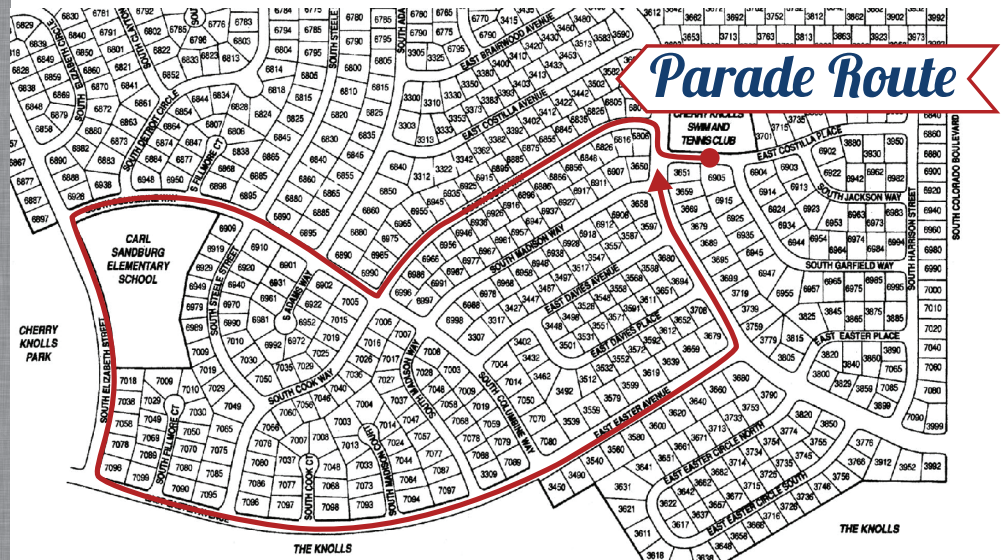
Hi, neighbors, hope you and your families continue to be safe and healthy at home. The usual neighborhood improvement work of your CKIA volunteers continues -- just spaced a bit further apart. There are two projects for which I'd like to share updates.



The perimeter fence was a major project for the neighborhood. This summer you'll see more routine maintenance to protect that investment. The fence will be re-stained, which not only provides a fresh appearance but also protects the posts and fencing from weather and wear. A few posts will be replaced along with minor repairs to loose or damaged boards. We'll communicate with neighbors along the perimeter so you can plan for this. For health and safety, we are minimizing repairs that require workers on your properties, but there may be limited times when crews may need access from the interior of properties. We're collecting bids for the work now, and we'll communicate the schedule by mail as that approaches.

Second, recruiting for new Board members usually starts around two months before elections held during our CKIA General Meeting, which will be Tuesday, November 10. (note: U.S. elections are the week before, November 3.) Because of social distancing, we aim to assemble the nominating committee earlier this year, in July. This committee identifies neighbors who are interested in serving in roles from Perimeter to President.
