President's Letter

Greetings, neighbors. We hope this update finds you and your families healthy and well. While so many of our routines are up in the air, here are a few updates on things happening within our neighborhood.

Fence work: Our Perimeter team led by Peggy Hansen and Diane Gimber has been hard at work on a round of maintenance and repairs on the fence. You may have already seen the results of this important effort to protect our investment in the perimeter fence. Work on the Colorado side went first with the Arapahoe side to follow.

Broadband: The City of Centennial has contracted with Ting to build out fiber broadband throughout the city. Cherry Knolls is the next neighborhood scheduled for build-out. This is scheduled to start in October. The fiber will be installed in-ground along the front City easement next to the sidewalk, and if you sign up Ting will run fiber from the street to your house. You should receive detailed information directly from Ting (ting.com) so watch your mail.

City plans: Thanks to Barb Shangraw and team for working with the City as we work through the transfer of the entrance property at Arapahoe and Nobles. Along with the light at Colorado and the bridge on Arapahoe, these City projects continue, if at a slower pace.

Fall meetings: our monthly meetings in September and October will be held as Zoom meetings. We hope to be able to host the November election meeting in-person, likely at an outdoor location. Please email contactckia@gmail.com for the zoom link and details.



CheKnolls Cup

Cherry Knolls has had a long standing rivalry; often mentioned among the greats like Hatfields and McCoys, Borg and McEnroe, and University of Colorado and Colorado State University. I am, of course, talking about our neighbors to the south, The Knolls. Our swim teams would meet every year regardless of being in the different divisions. There has always been a competitive nature between our two neighborhoods, fortunately, it is all in good fun and camaraderie.

We musn't forget the Che-Knolls Cup, it's coveted purse of a plaid blazer and a trophy cup began back in 1994. The competition has laid dormant for nearly two decades. This fabled tournament has very little record from its hay day, and it is often rumored that the Castle Pines International was overshadowed by it. We are unclear why it was canceled in 2002, stories vary and no one could be reached for comment. The original players who started the Che-Knolls Cup had no comment on it, mainly because I couldn't track any of them down. Recently, a bold young Knolls resident, Paul Prutch, dreamt of reviving the tournament. After reaching out to a few Cherry Knolls residents, Chad Naughton began recruiting. Quickly, Chad found many neighbors who wanted to get involved. Chad exclaimed, "this has been and incredible community organizing event. Many neighbors and sponsors have joined in and this tournament is happening organically."

Have you ever driven up the streets of Cherry Knolls and seen a neighbor doing something odd in their front yard? Back in January I stood in my front yard with my camera on a tripod taking glamour shot after glamour shot of myself, when a car pulled up and a woman got out and walked towards me. I made a fool of myself and asked if she was the cleaning lady. She laughed and said "No, I'm Nancy Taylor." I still continued as a fool and said, "I'm sorry I have no idea who Nancy Taylor is." She then told me she lived in this house many years ago. She saw my camera out and wondered why I was taking a picture of the blue spruce.

I chose not to go with the Rockefeller Center tree application, being that it was January. I told her the truth that I had to take a head shot for the February CKIA newsletter. She smiled and began to tell me about how when she was a kid, she went up to Frisco with her aunt Lois, who she described as "the first woman I ever knew to wear Blue Jeans." While driving Nancy in her old WWII jeep up a steep four-wheel drive trail and stopping to hike, Nancy found a beat-up soup can in an old ghost town building. She began looking for something to put in it and she decided to dig up a baby spruce to bring home with her:



Nancy planted that baby spruce on the north side of my house and today it stands over 30 feet tall. After hearing this story, I decided not to do what most people would do which is to report her to the forest service. I smiled with relief and I was grateful I didn't cut the monstrosity down when I first moved in I appreciate that blue spruce now for it is no longer just a giant evergreen killing my grass and obstructing my path to the back yard. It wields a story and I truly appreciate it now for its history. It is amazing how you hear stories about your house from your neighbors and you then look at it differently.

Nancy visits my neighbor Leta Long often. Nancy's mother, Carol, was best friends with Leta. She stood by her as Carol fought and lost her battle with cancer in my home in 2009. I often walk past Leta's house and wave as she sits on her porch for morning coffee. I smile as I imagine the laughter and tears that were shed on her porch as she sat with Carol not only watching their kids grow up on this street but also watching that baby spruce mature into one of our wisest trees in Cherry Knolls.
