We want to know what we are doing right, and what we are not doing right.



Linda Martin: Secretary



2020 has been a crazy year. Many people haven't been able to see their families for months or almost a year (like me!) But, the good news is that 2020 is over and there has been recent good news on the vaccine! Elementary school kids like me are also back to school in person (for now) and I hope it lasts.
