Update from our Centennial City Council Representative



Happy New Year!!! I've been asked to provide a few updates on what your City Council has been working on.

In December, the City Council passed the Master Development Plan (MDP) changes for the Streets at Southglenn. This will allow more residential units where the Sears building is located and the current Macy's building. Thanks to many neighbors that participated in the process this project is much better than initially proposed and will include a park area along Easter and a large set back.

I ultimately was the only no vote on this proposal based on the testimony both written and provided during the hearing and my concerns regarding the traffic at University and Easter.

The Arapahoe Bridge project is under way after a delay due to the Cherry Knolls shopping center changing ownership. An RFP was sent out and the bid was awarded to the same contractor that did the recent median improvements on Arapahoe Rd closer to University. This is an 18-month project and while lanes will be open in both directions, they are working on minimizing the traffic impact as much as possible. Unfortunately, for safety reasons the walking path under the bridge will be closed off during the entire time of the project and a detour will be posted.

In 2022, we will again offer our \$500 small community grant program. This is a great way to bring your neighbors together for a block party, neighborhood cleanup, movie night, holiday party, the possibilities are endless. The application for a grant request should be operational April 1st at the City of Centennial web site www.centennialco.gov

Councilmember Maurer and myself will be hosting a virtual District 2 chat on February, 15, 2022 beginning at 7 pm for 1 hour. These are casual opportunities to hear what is happening in the city and ask questions. I hope to "see" many of you there. We are looking at holding an in-person meeting in April but are still working out the details.

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President's

Corner



I grew up in the neighborhood west of Arapahoe High School called Arapahoe Highlands. When I was 8 years old, we had a record setting snowfall in January. My

dad and brothers worked together to shovel our giant circle driveway and a 6 foot section of street just beyond the driveway.

As we finished we saw a city plow come roaring up the street, tossing snow onto our driveway and street that we had just cleared! My dad, who was a certified hothead, ran out to the middle of the street screaming obscenities, jumping up and down, and waving his arms at the passing snowplow. My father, an intimidating man with his beard and stocky build, was approached by the young plow driver who could not have been much more than twenty four years old.

The driver politely apologized to my dad, explaining he meant no harm. He was just trying to make his rounds and earn an honest living. I felt bad for this young man - he did not deserve to be treated this way. My dad continued to aggressively confront him. Then, looking back at his sons, he saw that the driver wasn't much older than my brother Andy. I don't know what my dad realized at that moment but after that glance, he turned to the driver and apologized. That event has stuck with me to this day. The reason I'm sharing this story is that it has been reported that the snowplows did not finish plowing our streets on January 1st due to harassment by people in our neighborhood. It was reported that neighbors were aggressively confronting, yelling at the drivers and spitting on trucks.

80% of the Cherry Knolls residents want our streets to be plowed and the CKIA Board hired Kona to clear our streets. We pay for snow plow service when the snow is above 3 inches. In 2021 we only spent \$2500 of our allocated \$5000 approved by the Board. This summer we will renegotiate our contract and likely pay for an earlier more complete service that benefits everyone. The Contract with Kona is considered a non-priority contract. Please voice your comments, concerns or frustrations to CKIA Board and not Kona. The City is working hard getting ready for the 2022 Neighborhood Services programs. They will be hosting a "Large Community Improvement Grant Proposal Training" on February 15th and 17th at 6:00pm. The link for the meeting will be up on the City's website very soon. They will begin accepting Large Grant applications in March and the deadline for submittals will be 4/17.

The Small Community Grant Program is set to happen again in 2022, and residents will be allowed to begin applying for the grants funds on 4/1.



In Denver she became a community leader, philanthropist and aided settlement of former slaves during the time of Colorado's Gold Rush. She was known as the "Angel of the Rockies" and made her mark as Colorado's first black settler and a prosperous entrepreneur with investments in mining.




Our family has lived in Cherry Knolls for nearly a quarter century, and during all that time the entrances to Cherry Knolls have always looked pretty much the same as they are now. (Grateful kudos to Justin Dodson for working so hard to repair the cracking stucco entrance signs, by the way.) The Elizabeth Street entrance has always had beautiful flower beds and other plantings maintained by the Cherry Knolls Garden Club.

However, the entrances and Cherry Knolls Park didn't always look as they do now. This article features are historical photos from nearly 50 years ago – taken in 1973 and 1976 and shared by original Cherry Knolls resident Millie Fitzpatrick – of the Cherry Knolls entrances and Cherry Knolls Park, including projects by the Garden Club. According to notes accompanying the photos, "The Club was responsible for the original planting" at the entrances. They were primarily cactus, yucca, and other desert plants, as "the lack of water was a consideration in what was planted."

The Cherry Knolls Garden Club continues to be active, doing entrance weeding, watering, trimming and spring and fall clean-up. The Club notes on its web page: "We also enjoy outings to garden related events, classes, notable garden tours, as well as visiting each other's gardens for new and fun ideas in landscaping."

The Garden Club has many opportunities for volunteers: "There are one-time opportunities such as spring or fall clean-up, or partnering with another member to tidy up the garden. You might also consider being a Garden Club rep at the CKIA meetings or writing a gardening related article for the CKIA Newsletter. The west side of the entrance is watered by hand, so partnering with a member to help water would be great. There are many one-time or short-term opportunities!"

Knowledge of gardening is not a prerequisite to join the Garden Club. "We're all on a learning curve with gardening in Colorado. Join us for the garden tours or a class and put what you've learned into action in your own garden and at the Elizabeth entrance.
