Cherry Knolls Improvement Association (CKIA) and Cherry Knolls Swim and Tennis Club (CKS & TC) operate as separate entities.

CKIA currently maintains Cherry Field and holds a 100-year lease of Cherry Field for one dollar a year. CKIA understands the value of CKS & TC to Cherry Knolls, and both boards work very well together!

Pool membership for the 2022 season began on March 1st and sold out in less than 3 hours! This has never happened in the pool's history.

CKS & TC has a Board of Directors composed of 5-7 charter members. There are 222 Charter Members who are equity owners of the pool. Charter Memberships can be sold at any amount to community members inside and outside the community.

The pool was built in the 60s. Its equipment and facilities have lived long past its expected lifespan! CKIA sees the value in a continued partnership with CKS & TC. CKIA and CKS are starting to explore options for improvements and upgrades for the pool and clubhouse.

Dues are due! A dues FAQ for you:

How do I pay my dues?

You should have received your yearly dues request form in the mail in the last few weeks. If you have not please contact swisch@aol.com. You can pay online by scanning the QR code or mailing a check using the envelope enclosed with your form or dropping off a check to 6773 South Detroit Circle.

Why have the dues been raised?

We know you noticed that the annual dues have been raised from \$120 to \$180. We would like to remind you that dues have not been raised for 20 years but the prices for goods and services have increased many times over. The increase will help us to keep the neighborhood a special place!

What are dues used for?

Maintaining our perimeter (fence, weed mitigation, sign maintenance, electricity) • Taking care of Cherry Field • Funding neighborhood events such as Winterfest, the Easter Egg Hunt, Dumpster Days, snowplowing and our newest summer event, Family Field Day • Publishing a newsletter 6 times a year • Producing a neighborhood directory • Maintaining an active website • Paying insurance • Paying for new special projects to enhance the neighborhood

There is a section on your dues form that allows for additional contributions to help with our special projects which helps meet our obligations.

How do I update my personal information for the directory?

Paying your dues and making sure the information on the form is correct is important. Updating your neighborhood information at the same time you pay you dues allows us to make sure your information is correct on the website and in our neighborhood directory. Only dues paying members will receive a yearly directory.

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Centennial City Council Update

A few updates on what is happening in our city. At the end of February all 8 City Council Members, Mayor Piko and several City Staff members attended our strategic planning meeting. We spent most of Saturday discussing Affordable Housing Options for Centennial. As we all know the housing market makes it difficult to purchase or rent a home and those that want to downsize have limited options available. We began discussions last year and have been awarded a grant to hire a consultant to discuss possibilities that we have available. We will be reaching out for public input throughout the year. This is a topic of conversation in every community and we want to ensure we are making the best decisions for Centennial moving forward.

The Centennial Transportation Master Plan has been discussed and if you attended any of our events last year you probably were asked for your opinion. We will be releasing the next update in a few weeks for additional comment. The information will be sent out via all of our social media channels as well as our website.

This summer we will be hosting many events including the District 2 Summer Social. It will be held in June and the staff is working on the date/location. Last year was our first time hosting these types of events and they were so well attended with great music, yummy food trucks and games for all ages we had to do them again.

Our first big event will be on June 3rd to celebrate the Centennial Center Park's 10th year. This will be a birthday party-themed event and Arapahoe Libraries will be there so you can sign up for their summer reading program. When Cherry Knolls was created nearly 60 years ago, this area looked very different. Our subdivision was situated on relatively bare, rolling hills, lacking most of the stately trees that now grace this area. But what it lacked in foliage the neighborhood made up for with expansive views. Here is some wonderfully florid 1960s promotional copy from original builders Branch-Writer, Inc. and realtor L.C. Fulenwider, Inc. touting the hills of Cherry Knolls:

"From time immemorial, the concept of living on a hill has intrigued the imagination of man. Hills. The ancient city of Rome was built on seven of them. Throughout the ages, kings chose them for castle sites ... Now, add the gently flowing, yet strikingly dramatic hills of Cherry Knolls ... ascending to suburban living on a major scale of beauty and harmony with symphonic perfection ... What a view, the Rocky Mountains ... as you look down at them ... from Cherry Knolls!"

One can almost imagine "Bewitched" characters Larry Tate and Darrin Stevens laboring over martinis and cigarettes to come up with Cherry Knolls' ad copy.



Originally referred to as "Cherry Knolls Estates," our neighborhood had a sales office at 6724 South Detroit Circle and offered a variety of home designs "utilizing only the cream of the nation's architectural concepts and sparing no effort in the perfection of detail." While most designs were generally traditional in look, some foreshadowed the Brady Bunch esthetic, others had Tudor influences, and still others claimed inspiration from France or Spain.


Consider this classic example of midcentury realtor prose:

"Balboa: A French Provincial home with a Spanish name? Yes ... and with good reason. Balboa explored and discovered the Pacific. You explored and discovered the specific ... the very things you've always wanted in a home but were so afraid you'd never find ... And, again, the French come up with the perfect phrase ... chateau en Espagna ... a castle in the air. The Balboa ... a daydream come true!"

In this and coming issues, *Cherry Knolls News* will feature original promotional drawings and floor plans of various Cherry Knolls home models, and additional excerpts from Branch-Writer brochures. See if you can identify current homes of the same style. Many of our neighborhood's homes have been extensively remodeled over the years, but the solid craftsmanship of Branch-Writer has provided durable foundations.

Another bonus of participating is connecting with neighbors, which has turned the garage sale into a social highlight in the neighborhood.
