President's Corner



Hello Neighbors. Happy Spring!

While the capital campaign for the Nobles parcel is moving forward smoothly we are still short of our goal. We have currently raised \$18,900.00 for this project as of March 31st, which is outstanding. Thank you to everyone who contributed extra this year for the development of this parcel of land. There is still time to contribute more as this capital campaign will continue until we have enough to complete the project outside our annual expenses.

CKIA and its residents have always stepped up when the community needed them too. It is evident that the perimeter is very important to Cherry Knolls residents.

For example, CKIA built the surrounding fence over the course of approximately 15 years, It was built over 4 phases. Phase 1: Arapahoe Rd -Elizabeth Street to Split rail; Phase 2: Arapahoe Rd - Split rail to Steele Street; Phase 3: Arapahoe Rd - Steele Street to Salvation Army Parking lot; Phase 4: Colorado Blvd - Salvation Army to Nobles. We are fortunate to have a consistent matching fence surrounding this community. It does make a difference and we are grateful to the community for helping us achieve such a momentous project. Let's continue this for the Nobles parcel.

Long-Range Planning Committee:



Our capital campaign is going strong and we are looking forward to completing this project as your support makes funds available and the preliminary phases are completed. Thank you to all our neighbors who have paid their annual dues and contributed to the Nobles and Arapahoe entrance campaign. Need background on the project? Visit https://bit.ly/nobles-arapahoe

The total potential cost for the Nobles Re-Imagined project is still being estimated between \$210K to \$250K.

To date, we have raised \$18,920 specifically for the 2023 Capital Improvement Fund "Nobles Re-Imagined". 2023 dues total \$47,800 so far and we still expect to receive an additional \$32,200 if the same percentage of homes contribute this year as 2022. So far 40% of homes have paid, and last year we received dues from 69% of homes.

PHASE 1: NEW MONUMENT SIGN

Estimated cost of \$35,000

Our current stone sign faces Arapahoe and people do not see it as a welcoming sign into our neighborhood. The plan removes the current sign to create a new Cherry Knolls sign northwest, closer to Nobles, so inbound traffic can see it. The existing stone wall is blended into the landscape design. For this new "monument", we are working with the City of Centennial's project manager and contractors on the work they are doing at repairing the Elizabeth entrance to have continuity of design and materials. We hope to break ground in the second half of 2023. CKIA is applying for a \$10,000 grant offered by the City of Centennial to assist with this cost—cross your fingers!

PHASE 2: WATER TAP FOR IRRIGATION

Estimated cost of \$45,000

Before we begin landscaping we want to have irrigation for the first two to three years to establish new vegetation, as well as back up for any severe drought situations. Centennial recently assigned the parcel an address so the project committee can complete Denver Water's water tap application. We anticipate minimal traffic disruption along Nobles during tap installation thanks to the fortuitous location of the water main relative to the parcel. After the first two years with diligent monitoring, our self-sustaining plan will require little to no water annually. We hope to be under contract for the tap installation by fall 2023.

PHASE 3: LANDSCAPING

Estimated cost of \$130,000*

The native plant landscape plan, designed by Ransom Beegles of R Design, was presented and approved at the November 2022 General Membership Meeting. We have received bids from 3 different landscaping companies. The project committee recommended the lowest bid to the CKIA board and will continue negotiating a contract for approval to move forward. The company has experience with these types of projects, is receptive to committee input and the committee received positive references from our neighbors. The project committee includes members knowledgeable about xeriscape and native high desert plants and hopes to find additional resources to help offset the costs.

* If project complete in 2023. With delay we anticipate this cost plus inflation.

Note: We have received comments regarding the walkway pictured in the plans. The project committee agrees that this will not be used for sauntering through the landscape given the traffic on Arapahoe Road. We do need a path for maintenance—likely inexpensive crushed gravel. With each of these phases, we count on you to give us ideas and input to make this the best for our neighborhood.

Centennial City Council Update

Happy Spring! I know it's been a snowy winter and am looking forward to seeing the flowers starting to blossom. We've had lots of calls about snow and ice removal this year and I hope that you found the city was responsive when you called in. We are working our way through all of the ice dams throughout the city. In order to be responsible with your tax dollars our crews work within grid areas and with a city that is 13 miles long sometimes it takes awhile to get to each location.

The Centennial Community Grant program which provides up to \$500 grants to Centennial residents is now open. This is the 3rd year and some uses for these grants include block parties, neighborhood clean-up, yoga in the park and so much more. These grants allow you to host a community event and get to know your neighbors. Centennial also has a pop-up movie theater that you can check out. This includes everything but the movie and popcorn.

UPCOMING CENTENNIAL EVENTS: Centennial E-Recycling Event

Saturday, April 22nd from 8-11 AM at Centennial Civic Center located at 13133 E Arapahoe Rd. This is for household recycling only and no commercial loads will be accepted. The event is free hosted by our partner Jacobs, however a donation of two or more non-perishable food items or a \$5 minimum monetary donation benefiting the Salvation Army Centennial Corp is requested.

Chip & Mulch Event

Saturday May 6th from 8 AM – Noon at 2 locations the Willow Springs Service Center at 7200 S. Holly St or the Centennial Public Works facility at 7272 S Eagle St. This event is hosted by Centennial, South Suburban Parks & Rec, Jacobs and Terracare. Bring tree limbs and woody plant materials for recycling. Lumber, salvage materials or rounds larger than 10 inches in diameter will not be accepted. Free mulch will be available at the Willow Springs Service area throughout the event and at the Public Works facility starting at noon. Bring a tarp and shovel.

How to Hire a Contractor

- 1. Take your time.
- 2. Get up to 3 bids.
- 3. Hire a licensed contractor that's willing to obtain the permit (if you get a homeowners permit, you must have the knowledge to do the work).
- 4. Check the contractor insurance & bonding. Some trades only have national licenses.
- 5. Get references, 2-3 previous customers, ask for pictures.

- Get EVERYTHING in writing, construction documents/blueprints. A submitted plan is a legal document: to scale & kinds of materials and specifications, detailed scope of work.
- 7. Keep a job file to include: all emails and texts, documents.
- 8. Understand your right to cancel.
- 9. Do not pay up front! Gauge your payments with permit approvals.
- 10. Anticipate delays, allow time for communication.
