For those in the neighborhood who decided not to become members of the pool this year, I'm excited to water our garden beds CKIA manages. We are also in the process of building an irrigation plan for these flower beds.

CKIA has approved the cost to have a 30-year reserve study. This is necessary due to the lack of resources we have allocated to a future reserve on the repair and eventual rebuild of the perimeter fence. We raised Dues in 2021 to \$180. While this has helped enormously we are concerned it is still not sustainable for a volunteer community.



Centennial City Council Update

As I write this, we are kicking off Centennial events for the year and planning the Centennial/YMCA ribbon cutting on June 7th. I hope many of you will take advantage of all the programs that will be offered at the new YMCA facility over at the Streets at Southglenn. Centennial Under the Stars is Saturday, August 12th at the Centennial Center Park. Centennial Chalk Art Festival is on Saturday, September 16th at The Streets at Southglenn. And a NEW event this year will be SIP in Centennial which will have samples from Breweries, Distilleries and Wineries. Live Music, Food Trucks, vendors and fun activities for the entire family. This will be at the Centennial Civic Center Park on Saturday, October 21st. Hope to see you at these fun events.

I wanted to take some time to write about the recent Legislative Session and the Land Use Bill (SB23-213) that was introduced this year. Centennial City Council voted unanimously to oppose this bill for a number of reasons both as introduced and after several lengthy amendments. The Council truly appreciated Senator Kolker reaching out to us throughout the process to understand how it would impact our city. The Arapahoe County Commissioners including Commissioner Warren-Gully were also instrumental in contacting our state legislatures. The most concerning issue in this bill is our belief that decisions about land use are best made locally. After the City of Centennial was formed a Home Rule committee developed a Charter that was overwhelmingly supported in a vote by our citizens. If passed, this legislation would have appointed a Housing Committee of 18 to decide land use codes for the entire state.

The bill, after being introduced, went through 4 major revisions and at times included Accessory Dwelling Units by right on every single-family lot, Multiplexes by right on every single-family lot, and no parking requirements. The bill was amended so that Rural Resort communities and College towns would be excluded. The bill did include a regional housing study & needs assessment, which is a good first step to truly define the problem.

The bill also exempted many locations including Counties (Highlands Ranch, Meridian, etc). In Transit Oriented Development (TOD) Centennial would have had to absorb the required number of units around light rail and bus lines, resulting in impacts to existing neighborhoods.

The Governor has stated that he will continue to work on housing and we at the City of Centennial agree that the lack of housing in our community is an issue. We have spent the last 18 months determining our needs, engaging with the community and are now in the process of implementing strategies. We are hopeful that the Governor and the General Assembly will engage the local municipalities going forward so we can work in partnership to address our housing needs.

The Centennial Council also unanimously approved a resolution to ask the General Assembly to update the Construction Defect Law which is preventing condominium units from being constructed. Condo units used to be 20% of our total housing stock and is now down to 3%. Many of us are staying in our family homes as there is no place to downsize, resulting in lack of inventory. Condos allow first step to home ownership, are accessible by all, and allows those that want to stay in their community and opportunity to do so. The Council feels that if the state legislature were to work on this issue it will do more to resolve the housing crisis on a statewide level, then one size fits all zoning code.

I also want to thank all of you that contacted the members of the general assembly letting them know how you felt about this bill. I encourage all of you to stay engaged to ensure that local decisions continue to stay local.
